Baringa State Secondary College in conjunction with the Parents and Citizen's Association is offering scholarships to students enrolling in Year 7 in 2026 and our current students in Year 7-12. What is the Summit Program?

The Summit Program is a course for academically talented Junior Secondary School Students in Year 7 and 8 to better meet their needs, ensuring they develop intellectually and reach their full potential.

The Summit Program allows highly motivated students to be grouped together so they can be challenged and encouraged by their peers to work hard and continue to succeed in their studies.

Students may work at a higher level or faster pace and will also be challenged to develop higher order thinking skills. This program will assist in preparing students for their senior years of schooling and continue to engage them and enhance their love of learning.

What is the Summit Program?

- Students will be delivered the ACARA teaching and learning sequence pitched to the “A” level and explore extension with a targeted focus on higher order and critical thinking skills;
- Subjects may be covered in greater depth;
- Emphasis on reading, writing and higher order thinking skills;
- Possible involvement in extracurricular activities;
- Emphasis on success in all forms of assessment;
- Engage in alternate English and Maths testing; and
- Involvement in competitions.

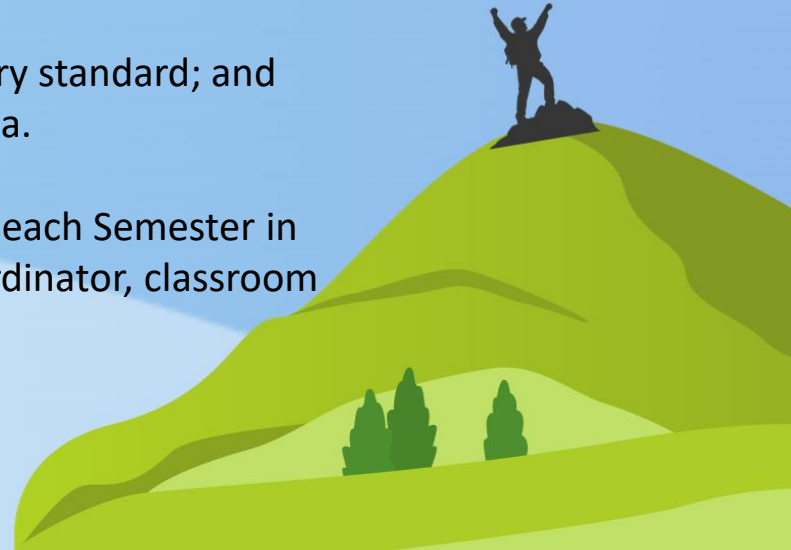

Entry Criteria

- Students must be achieving and maintain a grade point average of 4.5 and above for English, Maths, Science and Humanities. Results in Japanese, Physical Education and Arts/Technology electives may be taken into consideration;
- Students must be achieving and maintaining an “excellent” or “very good” on their report card for behaviour and effort;
- Home study in all classes must be completed to a satisfactory standard; and
- Students must meet and maintain the Good Standing criteria.

Review of each of the above criteria will be done at the end of each Semester in consultation with the Deputy Principal, Junior Secondary Co-ordinator, classroom teachers and Head of Year.

Good Standing

The expectation of 'Good Standing' aims to recognise and assist all students to take responsibility for their actions and to encourage each to improve their general performance.

Good Standing Criteria includes:

- Attendance is 95% and above;
- Excellent behaviour inside and outside the classroom at all times;
- Meeting the requirements of the Student Dress Code;
- Meeting the College's expectations around appropriate use of their iPad and connecting to Apple Classroom at all times;
- Meeting the College's expectations around mobile device/ear bud use;
- Demonstration respectful relationships with all members of the school community; and
- Demonstrating our RIC values through their actions within the college and wider community.

A student may be immediately removed from the Summit Program if:

- A student's behaviour is such that they are placed on a monitoring card;
- A student's behaviour is such that they are placed in Growth Space or on an Alternative Timetable; or
- A student is suspended from the College.

Where does the Summit Program Lead?

- Invitation into a Summit class in Year 9 and 10;
- In Year 11 and 12, students will have the opportunity to study an ATAR pathway; and
- In Year 10 or Year 11 students may have the opportunity to complete a Headstart course through the University of the Sunshine Coast.

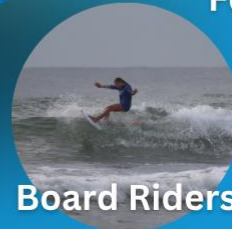
